The first auto race from Milan to Sanremo took place in 1906. What eventually came to be known as the Coppa Milano Sanremo was on again and off again for most of the twentieth century, until the final race was run in 1973. Now the auto race has been revived for the twenty-first century. In Spring 2003 more than 180 classic cars dating to 1973 and earlier were accepted into the competition. Once again an annual event, this fantastic 200-plus-mile race combines sport and skill with a course that winds through the spectacular Italian landscape and along the coast to the resort on the Ligurian Sea.

As official timekeeper for this historic event, Doxa has manufactured a commemorative wristwatch, the Coppa Milano Sanremo 2003 automatic chronograph. A limited edition of only 250 pieces worldwide, it is only available through the Doxa website. It features a 12-hour rotating bezel, a stainless steel case and a sapphire crystal. The screw-down caseback holds a stainless steel medallion engraved with the race logo and is water-resistant to 100 meters. The screw-in crown is engraved with the Doxa name.

The Lemania 283 movement that powers this wristwatch is assembled from new old stock parts, which Doxa has retained since the 1970s. The 40-jewel movement has a power reserve of 42 hours and measures 30mm in diameter with a height of only 6.5mm. Its frequency is 28,800 bph, and it features an Incabloc shock protection system. This is the same movement found in many prestigious chronographs of the '70s and '80s.
